VISITORS SECURITY AND SAFETY INFORMATION

Visitors Pass (Badge)

When entering ESA HQ, all visitors must report to Reception and show a valid identity document (passport, driver's license) to receive a personal access badge. Please wear your visitor personal access badge visibly at all times during your stay at ESA HQ and return the badge to Reception on departure. You may enter and leave the building by badging in and out at the entrance barrier. If you are participating in a meeting, proceed straight to the meeting room.

Otherwise, state the name of the person expecting you, and that person shall be contacted in order to accompany you from reception.

Within ESA HQ:

- Visitors' movements inside the building are restricted, unless they are accompanied by an ESA staff member.
- Outside meeting rooms, visiting meeting participants are expected to be accompanied by the person in charge of the meeting.

 All visitors must obey the general instructions in force at HQ, and heed warning notices.





THE EUROPEAN SPACE AGENCY (ESA)

The European Space Agency is dedicated to the peaceful exploration and use of space for the benefit of humankind. Established in 1975, we work together with our 22 Member States to push the frontiers of science and technology, and promote economic growth in Europe. Space is the future and through ESA we are all part of it.

What does ESA do?

In short, ESA's job is to draw up the European space programme and carry it through. ESA's programmes are designed to find out more about Earth, its immediate space environment, our Solar System and the Universe, as well as to develop satellite-based technologies and services, and to promote European industries. ESA also works closely with space organisations outside Europe.

ESA's purpose shall be to provide for, and to promote, for exclusively peaceful purposes, cooperation among European States in space research and technology and their space applications, with a view to their being used for scientific purposes and for operational space applications systems

Where is ESA located

ESA's headquarters are in Paris which is where policies and programmes are decided. ESA also has sites in a number of European countries, each of which has different responsibilities:

- EAC, the European Astronauts Centre in Cologne, Germany;
- **ESAC**, the European Space Astronomy Centre, in Villanueva de la Canada, Madrid, Spain;



- **ESOC**, the European Space Operations Centre in Darmstadt, Germany;
- ESRIN, the ESA centre for Earth Observation, in Frascati, near Rome, Italy;
- **ESTEC,** the European Space Research and Technology Centre, Noordwijk, the Netherlands.
- **ECSAT**, the European Centre for Space Applications and Telecommunications, Harwell, Oxfordshire, UK.
- **ESEC**, the European space Security and Education Centre, Redu, Belgium.

ESA also has liaison offices in Belgium, USA and Russia; a launch base in French Guiana and ground/tracking stations in various parts of the world.
