THE EUROPEAN SPACE AGENCY (ESA)



The European Space Agency is dedicated to the peaceful exploration and use of space for the benefit of humankind. Established in 1975, we work together with our 22 Member States to push the frontiers of science and technology, and promote economic growth in Europe. Space is the future and through ESA we are all part of it.

What does ESA do?

In short, ESA's job is to draw up the European space programme and carry it through. ESA's programmes are designed to find out more about Earth, its immediate space environment, our Solar System and the Universe, as well as to develop satellite-based technologies and services, and to promote European industries. ESA also works closely with space organisations outside Europe.

ESA's purpose shall be to provide for, and to promote, for exclusively peaceful purposes, cooperation among European States in space research and technology and their space applications, with a view to their being used for scientific purposes and for operational space applications systems

Where is ESA located

ESA's headquarters are in Paris which is where policies and programmes are decided. ESA also has sites in a number of European countries, each of which has different responsibilities:

- EAC, the European Astronauts Centre in Cologne, Germany;
- **ESAC**, the European Space Astronomy Centre, in Villanueva de la Canada, Madrid, Spain;



- **ESOC**, the European Space Operations Centre in Darmstadt, Germany;
- **ESRIN**, the ESA centre for Earth Observation, in Frascati, near Rome, Italy;
- **ESTEC,** the European Space Research and Technology Centre, Noordwijk, the Netherlands.
- **ECSAT**, the European Centre for Space Applications and Telecommunications, Harwell, Oxfordshire, UK.
- **ESEC**, the European space Security and Education Centre, Redu, Belgium.

ESA also has liaison offices in Belgium, USA and Russia; a launch base in French Guiana and ground/tracking stations in various parts of the world.

GETTING HERE

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION



Radisson Blu Hotel, Franklinstraße 65, 60486, Frankfurt am Main, Germany. Airport

Frankfurt has one airport. From there, you can reach the event site by

- *Train*: the airport has its own train station, Frankfurt Flughafen Fernbahnhof. Take any train heading towards Frankfurt Hauptbahnhof, then take another train directed to Frankfurt West. The hotel is a 15 minutes walk from there.
- *Car:* get on B43, then take A5 to Frankfurt-Katharinenkreisel/B44 in Innenstadt II. Take the exit toward Rödelheim/Bockenheim from A648. Continue on Frankfurt-Katharinenkreisel, then continue onto Voltastraße, turn left onto An d. Dammheide, turn left onto Solmsstraße, turn right.

Bus

Look for buses going to Frankfurt (Main) Katharinenkreisel or Frankfurt (Main) An der Dammheide.

Tram

You can reach the nearest tram station at Frankfurt An der Dammheide by taking line 17 (from Frankfurt Hauptbahnhof).

Metro

Frankfurt has a metro system called the U-Bahn. The nearest station to the Radisson Blu Hotel isFrankfurt (Main) Kirchplatz (26 minutes walk).
